Nursery Rhyme Week

November 13th

In November, we participated in World Nursery Rhyme Week, exploring the literacy concept of rhyme, while having some fun with nursery rhymes. World Nursery Rhyme Week focuses on 5 well known nursery rhymes and this year, they were: Jack & Jill, Hickory Dickory Dock, Head, Shoulders, Knees & Toes, Row Row Row Your Boat and Wheels On The Bus. The children quickly identified the rhyming words they could hear, and we explored what other words rhymed. Not only did we discover rhyming, we also investigated different clocks from Hickory Dickory Dock and we discovered what a well was, from Jack & Jill. We had a lot of fun with the song Down By The Bay, hearing funny rhyming and making up our own, as well as learning nursery rhymes in different languages, including Auslan. The children were also able to use technology as they used the iPad to identify rhyming words via a rhyme game. Hearing and using rhyme, rhythm and repetition helps children develop early literacy skills, and we encourage you to sing some nursery rhymes with your children today!

Phonemic Awareness Programme



The children enjoyed exploring the /g/ sound with Golden Girl! This included exploring gold through treasure hunts, stories and educational clips. We even sprayed our hair green and gold. The children used the smartboard to practise writing the letter g in the air. They also used gold materials to create collages with.



As we learnt about the /e/ sound, we were set on an /e/ word challenge, reaching 35 words by the end of the fortnight. Not only did this support the children's ability to produce the /e/ sound but also broadened their vocabulary. We created Elmer Elephant collages and elephants with party blower trunks (sorry Mums and Dads).

For our last sound of the year, the children were introduced to Uppy Umbrella for the /u/ sound. With Uppy Umbrella, we explored under the sea creatures and everything underground. We also talked about what sounds the children will explore at big school.

Another year has flown by and the preschoolers and I have enjoyed our time this year as we worked together on LE activities. We learnt and practiced skills that mean when the children start school they are ready for the challenges – and the bonus is we have had so much fun and made so many messes. Thank you for the opportunity to work with your children. Sadly I farewell the Schoolies, but know they are prepared and ready for the next stage in their education.

Cooking—Our cooking experiences created great discussion in 'From Farm to Fork' week as we talked about all the ingredients and where they originated, with the preschoolers sharing information they had learnt in Discovery Time. They transferred what they had learnt in other cooking experiences and used math skills as we measured ingredients, collaborated as we added and mixed the batter, checked we had followed the recipe - showing they understood the relationship between the written words and what we were doing.



Creative Recycling – Our recycling bin was overflowing with donations from families so we emptied it out onto the mat and the preschoolers let their imaginations run wild as they created wonderful sculptures. Through this task they applied a wide variety of thinking strategies to build their models, and to solve any problems that occurred in the process.

Eddy the Elephant – It was great to see how the preschoolers' fine motor cutting skills had developed over the year as they cut out their elephant face showing their emerging autonomy, and they confidently communicated with me if they needed assistance. With encouragement they persisted with the task showing pride in their work when they had finished.



Graduation Hats – Each year we make the Schoolies graduation hats that they can keep. As we worked together the preschoolers confidently expressed their ideas, feeling and understandings about school next year, showing they are effective communicators.
